What do you believe are the most critical issues for the local 2SLGBTQIA+ community? If elected, how would you work with the local community to address these issues?

I'll continue to support the Township of Wilmot's continued financial assistance to local support organizations such as Wilmot Family Resource Centre and Interfaith Counselling Centre through grant programs.
