I think that affordable housing needs to be an ongoing topic. I think that mental health is a regular concern, and needs to be kept in the forefront. Since I have been working in mental health all of my life, as a psychotherapist, I am interested in keeping mental health front and centre. Homelessness is in our community. I am a board member of the Wilmot Family Resource Centre in Wilmot which provides food at the food bank and other resources for people who are homeless. I want to keep this issue as an ongoing concern as well.
