Those wards are still there today but are or were empty. I asked that they be reopened as an evaluation center. Homeless would go there, be assessed and resources made available. Some will still not want to come; they want their own space and I totally understand this. Working with GRCA and municipalities could we not take a stretch of land and put tiny homes on it with a hub like the indigenous long house which would have services to assist these individuals.
