What do you believe are the most critical issues for the local 2SLGBTQIA+ community? If elected, how would you work with the local community to address these issues?

I think one of the most critical issues is stigma and marginalization. It surprises me that in a community as diverse as ours, we are still dealing with a lack of compassion and understanding and that there are so many barriers. I would love to try to make institutional changes and implement policies that address these issues and are inherently inclusive. I would love to see more art and cultural expression that celebrates our diversity and lived experiences.

Have you ever participated in 2SLGBTQIA+ Cultural Competency Training?

I'm not sure if I have, but I have attended a few community information sessions and roundtables to learn more about 2SLGBTQIA+ youth and adults and their experiences in the region and what they would like to see and projects they are working on.

Systemic homophobia, biphobia, and transphobia are still prevalent in our community, resulting in significant socioeconomic disparities within 2SLGBTQIA+ communities. If elected, how will you combat homophobia, biphobia, and transphobia?

I will ensure that any policies or programs being implemented are equitable and clearly worded. I will also review any policies that people bring to my attention.

If elected, how would you address the ongoing issues of homelessness and mental health, especially as they disproportionately affect members of the 2SLGBTQIA+ community?

Part of my platform is to increase access to health facilities and increase mental health supports. If there is a demonstrated need in the community I want to ensure that it is a priority. As well, I want to be a part of the solution of increasing supportive and subsidized housing to reduce the wait times and ensure our youth, marginalized populations, and seniors are not left behind.

Do you agree with the statement that "trans rights are human rights, and must be protected as such?" Yes, absolutely. Every member of our community is important.



What is one motion would you bring to council that you think will improve the lives of specifically queer people, racialized individuals and/or marginalized residents and why?

I would like to bring a motion that we have a panel of self-identified 2SLGBTQIA+, youth, seniors, racialized and otherwise marginalized people that give feedback on what the region is doing and how their policies are positively or negatively impacting their communities (beyond what we have now). I really hope that if I am elected, I can increase public engagement with the region. I want all community members to feel like their voices matter and that they are an important part of our community.

When thinking about our schools, do you agree that 2SLGBTQIA+ representation in books and lessons is critical at all grade levels? How would you support 2SLGBTQIA+ students in schools?

Representation is important. Books should be available in schools and accessible. The school board has more say in what is included but information should be available.
